

CIPESS: WHERE WE ARE

n our previous outing, we substantially reminisced the journey of Center for Innovation in Procurement, Environmental and Social Standards (CIPESS), Joseph Sarwuan Tarka University, Makurdi (JOSTUM) to an expectant extent. However, as a Center obligated to build sustainable human capacity through training, professionalisation and research in the areas of Procurement, Environmental and Social Standards, work is in steady progress and the Center is consistently breaking grounds and achieving milestones in line with its mission and mandate.

As the hub for professional training in North Central Nigeria, CIPESS has progressively concluded arrangements for the establishment of more study Centers in Kogi, Kwara and Niger State of the North Central region. This is in addition to the already established and operated Centers in Benue, Nasarawa, Abuja and Plateau State. The takeoff of study Centers in Kogi, Kwara and Niger State is eminent because arrangements are at an advanced stage as the Center has carried out facility assessment, signed Memoranda of Understanding, facilitated stakeholders' engagement, and conducted Training of Trainers exercises in the states.

To ensure continuous human capacity development in Procurement, Environmental and Social Standards through training and professionalization, the Center on 17th July, 2023 simultaneously launched yet another short courses training in Lafia and Keffi both in Nasarawa State. Participants enrolled for training in these study centers would soon be issued certificates of participation.

Within the period under review, CIPESS has had its second phase of independent thirdparty verification exercise featuring the Center's activities from June, 2022 to June, 2023.
