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## CIPESS HOSTS VICE CHANCELLORS AND PROCUREMENT OFFICERS TO AN EXECUTIVE TRAINING

n a progressive move to build sustainable human capacity for those in leadership positions, the Center for Innovation in Procurement, Environmental and Social Standards (CIPESS), Joseph Sarwan Tarka University Makurdi (JOSTUM) on Tuesday,20th February 2024organized an Executive Education Workshop for Vice Chancellors and Directors of Procurement of Universities in North Central Nigeria. The workshop held the conference hall of the Committee of Vice Chancellors of Nigerian Universities Abuja.



The Center Leader and Director Professor Lami A. Nnamonu, in a welcome address expressed delight and commended participants for availing themselves for the workshop despite their busy schedules. She emphasized the role of best procurement practices within the University system stating that a clear understanding and application of procurement best practices would go a long way in addressing incidences of corruption within Nigerian Universities. She called on the participants to make the most out of the workshop for the benefit of their institutions.

Dr. Joshua Atah in his goodwill message apologetically confessed to have underrated JOSTUM during the bidding phase of the project but expressed satisfaction on the feats recorded by the Center within the short period of project commencement. Dr. Attah said, "Every time I get invited to CIPESS FUAM events I always leave with this impression that sometimes you should not be in a hurry to write people off but again we thank you for not just living up to expectation but also even living beyond expectation." The SPESSE National Project Coordinator called on the Vice Chancellors and Procurement officers to cherish every moment of the workshop for future benefits. "I urge all the Vice-Chancellors that are here today to take a look at what is going on here and see if you can key into it-who knows if there is another round of this programme or a similar programme, you may be in a better position to bid for it" He stated.

Relatedly, Prof. Yakubu A. Ochefu, Secretary-General Committee of Vice-Chancellors of Nigerian Universities and Director- General of the Bureau of Public Procurement, represented by the Director, regulation and database, Bureau of Public procurement, Aliyu Aliyuin separate remarks congratulated the Center Leader and Director and the entire management team for organizing the workshop and urged them to make such workshops constant. Prof. Yakubu noted that, "Procurement issues are very nutty issues. Given the type of background Vice-Chancellors come from these are not things that are in their everyday repertoire as they are rising through their academic career and when they come to the level of leadership and are confronted with nitty gritty of procurement, it is important that we ground some of their understanding of it." He added that the procurement workshop will no doubt have a positive impact on the Vice chancellors of Nigerian Universities. Earlier, the Vice-Chancellor Joseph Saruwan Tarka University Makurdi, Engr. Prof. Isaac N. Itodo expressed gratitude to the Center Leader and her team for their dedication and for making the University proud. He further urged participants to ensure the stepping down of the knowledge acquired in their respective Universities. "This workshop will fill the knowledge gap in the procurement process and will help VCs and Procurement Officers to firmly take control of the procurement processes and avoid criminal default that will invoke the wrath of anti-corruption agencies." He further stated.

The Deputy Center Leader, Procurement Standards Prof. Simon Kpelai during the closing phase of the workshop expressed gratitude to the Center Leader for availing such an avenue for learning and improving industry best practices. He commended the Vice-Chancellors and Procurement Officers for their endurance, consistency and sacrifice to be part of the workshop. He encouraged them to apply the knowledge gained so as to impact their respective institutions positively.



The three-day workshop featured presentation of lectures from procurement mavens, interactive sessions, soapbox sessions as well as the drafting of a communique proposing areas that can be improved upon in the 2007 Procurement Act.




























## **CIPESS GRADUATES 245 PARTICIPANTS IN JOS**


He urged valedictorians not to undermine the certificates issued to them as they were worthy of changing their lives.
