CIPESS IS THE FLAGSHIP PROGRAMME OF THE UNIVERSITY—JOSTUM VC.

he Vice Chancellor of Joseph Sarwuan Tarka University, Makurdi (JOSTUM), Engr Prof. Isaac N. Itodo, has rated the Center for Innovation in Procurement and Social Standards (CIPESS) as the University's flagship initiative.

Prof. Itodo made this statement in his conference room on Monday, April 22, 2024, while speaking with the World Bank Sustainable Procurement, Environmental, and Social Standards Enhancement (SPESSE) Project Results Verification team.

According to the Vice Chancellor, who charmingly stated that he lacks the words to explain how beneficial CIPESS has been to the University, stated that CIPESS has transported the University everywhere. He affirmed that the Center has successfully conducted procurement training for Vice Chancellors and Procurement Officers in the North Central Zone.

He emphasized how the Center of Excellence has projected the institution, saying, "We've taken the story of procurement and environmental sustainability to the nooks and crannies of this country." He went on to say that "we have reached out to the segments of society-whether to the least or most educated by organising workshops and seminars and issuing certificates.'

The University Don stated that if the institution was not previously recognized for anything, the Center has brought it to light, which is why it is referred to as the university's flagship programme. The school head pledged management's assistance to ensure the Center's continued success and stated that measures were in the works to assure the Center's sustainability even after the World Bank's withdrawal.

He intimated that relevant government entities and agencies would be contacted in the hopes of receiving approvals shortly so that the Center could operate as an institute within the University. He consequently highlighted that the Center has been grafted into the University framework and has come to stay.

Earlier in his remarks, Dr Peter Tobrise, a representative of the National Universities Commission (NUC), noted that the main purpose of the visit was to assist in the development of a sustainable university in terms of procurement, environmental, and social standards. This, he stated, was in lieu of the covenant binding on the Programme and commission to ensure that the acclaimed findings were verified.

He maintained that the NUC's primary responsibility was to facilitate a smooth exercise, while the Independent Verification Agency would check the books to confirm the Center's renowned accomplishments.

In the same vein, Chinatu Onwuegbuchi of the Independent Verification Agency (IVA) indicated in her remarks that the exercise was not a witch-hunt, but rather a statutory duty related to the Sustainable Procurement, Environmental and Social Standards Enhancement (SPESSE) project. She insisted that it was not only mandatory, but also necessary, so the Center's credibility was not jeopardized.

The SPESSE 3rd round verification exercise was to be conducted by Binomial Optimal Limited, an Independent Verification Agency (IVA) comprising a representative from the National Universities Commission.

On Tuesday, March 16, 2024, Professor Egbe-Okpenge made this statement via Zoom during a presentation at the Sexual Exploitation and Abuse/Sexual Harassment (SEA/SH) workshop for CIPESS Project Officers.

The Gender and Social Development Officer maintained that CIPESS is a world Bank-sponsored Center of Excellence, and the World Bank (WB) and the National Universities Commission (NUC) were committed to ensuring a work environment that minimizes any negative impacts on the local environment and its workers. According to her, "The Project is

ender and Social Development expected to strongly commit to creating Officer (GSDO) of the Center for and maintaining an environment in which Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (SEA) and Sexual Harassment (SH) have no place. She emphasized that the act will not be tolerated from any employee, participant, stakeholder, representative of the project."



Speaking on the concept of "consent," the Gender Officer said, "If the agreement is obtained using threats, lies, coercion, abduction, fraud, manipulation, deception, misrepresentation, or exploitation of power imbalance, it is not consent." She informed that consent cannot be given by anyone under the age of 18, regardless of the age of maturity or age of consent locally. She added that, the mistaken belief regarding the age of the child was not a defense.

Professor Mrs Egbe-Okpenge who explained that sexual harassment constitutes gross misconduct and could lead to termination or other consequences related to employment and employment status further called on Project staff and faculty to endeavour to read and sign the Code of Conduct document after attending SEA/SH awareness meetings and trainings.
